

### **Guidance on Preparing Workplaces for COVID-19**



The U.S. Department of Labor's
Occupational Safety and Health
Administration (OSHA) published
"Guidance on Preparing Workplaces for
COVID-19" to help companies respond in
the event of coronavirus in the workplace.
The guidance was developed in

collaboration with the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services (HHS). The document provides practical guidance for preventing the spread of COVID-19, also known as novel coronavirus, and contains information on safe work practices and appropriate personal protective equipment based on the risk level of exposure. In addition to the guidance, OSHA recently launched a <a href="COVID-19">COVID-19</a> webpage.

### MARCH 31, 2020 DEADLINE FOR UCO ALUMS

ATTENTION UCO SAFETY GRADS FROM AUGUST 1, 2005 THROUGH MARCH 31, 2019

The University of Central Oklahoma's Bachelor in Industrial Safety has been reviewed by the Board of Certified Safety Professionals (BCSP) and approved as a Graduate Safety Practitioner® (GSP®) Qualified Academic Program (QAP), providing the program's graduates the opportunity to apply with BCSP for the GSP designation after graduation.

The GSP meets the credential requirement for the Certified Safety Professional® (CSP®), the "gold standard" in safety certification, allowing those who hold the designation to waive the Associate Safety Professional® (ASP®) certification examination. It demonstrates accomplishment and commitment to professional development.

A GSP QAP is a degree program in safety, health and environmental practices that has been reviewed by BCSP and demonstrates a substantial match to the ASP Exam Blueprint. Any person having graduated from the University of Central Oklahoma's with a B.S. in Industrial Safety since August 1, 2005 may apply for the GSP within their program's applicable dates as it appears on the QAP list. The deadline for those who graduated between August 1, 2005 and March 31, 2019 is March 31, 2020.

## NSC OPENS NEW SCHOLARSHIP FOR WOMEN

#### APPLICATIONS DUE BY MARCH 31ST

The National Safety Council is introducing a new scholarship program for women seeking post-secondary education to pursue a career in EHS – environment, health and safety – or related field. Lorraine Pack Memorial Scholarship winners receive a \$2,000 tuition award and the opportunity to attend at no cost either NSC Congress & Expo, or the Campbell Institute Symposium.

Applications for this year's scholarship will be accepted online through March 31.

Only NSC student members are eligible for the

Lorraine Pack Memorial Scholarship. Students can apply for a free NSC membership <a href="here">here</a>. Eligible students must be enrolled in community college, a technical program, apprenticeship or bachelor's degree program within the United States (either in-person or online). They may be enrolled full or part time and must graduate no earlier than May 2021. Finalists will be notified by May 1.
